FROM OUR TASMANIAN CORRESPONDENT

Heard from Dave Swallow who writes:

Hi lan

Left my old job and trying something dear to my heart, of course fly fishing

Thanks for passing on my info to the members, only to happy to help them catch a bag of fish.

Last season was a tough, many of the go to lakes under performed due to the bad floods we incurred in June and July, but we're hoping for a better season this year as a settled winter is forecasted.

Due to the June/July floods, Penstock was the only lake to fished consistently both early season on wets and summer months on mayfly / red spinners.

We average around 10 good fish per outing with an occasional trip catching numbers around 15 to 20, a mix of browns and rainbows.

Land based fishers averaged one or two good fish a day

Since I've been in Tassie I realised that fishing from a boat is a more successful means to increase catch rates and more importantly having a guide that knows the waters especially how to fish to them and correct fly selection.

This I have learnt over the last 5 years with some very good fishermen including Joe Riley a long time Australian Team fly fishing representative.

If you are over next Feb, please give me a call would love to come up to Liawenee and have a glass of Tassie Red with you and if before, happy to help you enjoy your fishing experience and also a glass of red.

I will be on the water starting 6th August, will send you fishing reports for the monthly mag.

The Tasmanian trout season starts the first week of August and if all falls in to place the Mayfly's will hopefully start in December and go through to late March. In the mean time, we will be fishing sinking lines such as Sixth Sense Di3 & 5's using Shrek's, Bombers and Zombies with great success.

Both Four Springs and Penstock are in great condition and the fish willing to have a go.

If any member is thinking of coming down to have some fun catching good 3lb plus Browns and rainbows, I am available to guide and my new boat is ready to get you out amongst them.

FROM THE FLY TIERS DESK - EMERGER



Fix the hook in the vise. Run the tying thread on at the eye and wind it down the shank in close turns to a point opposite the barb. Take a pinch of gray cul-de-canard fibers and catch it in as the tail.



2 Tease out a pinch of olive Antron dubbing fur and apply it thinly to the tying thread. Twist it into a slim rope and wind it two-thirds of the way to the eye.



3 Choose two cul-de-canard plumes of equal size and of the same shade of gray. Put them together so that their tips are level and secure just in front of the body with a few turns of thread.



4 Take a second pinch of olive Antron and apply it to the tying thread. Wind the fur up to the eye to form a distinct thorax.



5 With the tying thread just behind the eye, take a needle and loop the cul-de-canard plumes around it. Keeping tension on the loop, secure the butts with thread at the eye.




6 With the looped back formed, remove the excess plumes with scissors. Finally, build a small, neat head with the thread before casting off with a whip finish.
