FROM THE FLY TIERS DESK-DUN



1 Fix the hook in the vise and run the tying thread down the shank from the eye to opposite the barb. Catch in a few fibers of dark brown cock hackle and 2 inches (5cm) of fine, oval, gold tinsel.



2 Wind close turns of thread over the waste ends of the hackle fibers and tinsel to provide an even base for the body. Dub on a pinch of dark brown fur and wind it on to form a slim body.



3 Wind on four turns of the gold tinsel and secure. Select two slips of hen pheasant feathers, taken from opposing wings. Place them together, dull-sides in, so that their tips are level and the feathers curve away from each other.



4 Catch in the hen pheasant wings with a winging loop just in front of the body.



5 Secure the wings with tight thread turns before trimming off the waste ends. Use turns of thread around the wing base to bring the wings upright.



6 Prepare a dark brown cock hackle with fibers twice the length of the hook gape. Catch it in at the wing base, and make three turns behind and two turns in front of the wing. Secure and remove the waste end before casting off.
