exchanged thoughts about other places to fish in the local area which were later visited by some on their way home.


Pleased to report that Darren managed to land a great fish later in the day at Dean Reservoir

2015 ONE FLY—NEWLYN RESERVOIR




Where did "piss poor" come from?


But worse than that were the really poor folk who couldn't even afford to buy a pot—they "didn't have a pot to piss in", and were the lowest of the low.

So, the next time you are washing your hands and complain because the water temperature isn't just how you like it, think about how things used to be.





FROM THE FLY TIERS DESK—BIBIO



Once the hook is fixed in the vise, run the tying thread from the eye to a position opposite the barb. Catch in 2 inches (5cm) of fine, oval, silver tinsel, allowing the waste end to lie along the hook shank.



2 Secure the waste end to the hook with thread wraps. This will form an even base for the body. Dub on a pinch of black seal fur and wind it along one-third of the shank.



3 At this point, dub on an even smaller amount of red fur. Apply this to form a bright section.



4 Dub on another pinch of black seal fur the same size as the first. Wind it to the eye to form the third section of the body. Catch in a black cock hackle at the eye and, using a technique known as palmering, wind the hackle in evenly spaced turns along the length of the body.




5 Take hold of the fine, oval, silver tinsel and wind it so that it crosses each hackle turn.



At the eye, secure the tinsel and remove it, along with the excess hackle point. Catch in a second, longer-fibered hackle and wind on three turns to form a collar. Secure the waste end and trim before casting off.

Competition Rules:

- 1. Fly Caught trout shall be the only species to be eligible with the minimum size weighed in been 25 cm.
- 2. All fish to be eligible for the trophy must have been caught during the competition hours and presented for weigh in, by the stated closing time on each day of the competition.
- The Traphy shall be awarded to the club, whose member has cought the fleaviest fish during the competition hours.
- All competing fishers must sign on personally at the sign-on point at the Creswick Caravan Park, PRIOR to commencing fishing.
- Competitors must comply with all state fishing and boating regulations
