#### YOU ARE INVITED TO THE "WILD TROUT CONFERENCE"



Freshwater anglers can learn more about Victoria's wild trout fisheries at a <u>free one day</u> conference to be held in November at Mansfield.

Fisheries Victoria Executive Director, Travis Dowling, said the conference was funded by fishing licence fees and the State Government's *Target One Million* plan for recreational fishing, which aims to get more Victorians fishing more often by increasing participation to one million by 2020.

"The conference will assemble fisheries scientists and recreational anglers to share the findings of research conducted on riverine trout populations over the last 12 months, Mr Dowling said.

"In 2013, trout anglers told us that High Country streams had not fished well so we embarked on a substantial three year research project to investigate further.

"This conference is all about sharing the results from the first year of field work so that anglers, and angling dependent businesses, build an understanding of our trout fisheries and their key drivers.

"Amongst the presentations will be topics ranging from spawning success in 12 wild trout rivers, trout movement in the Delatite River from the acoustic tracking project, and measuring the contribution stocked trout have made to anglers' catches in two rivers.

"The conference will also feature a key note address from Dr Dan Dauwalter of Trout Unlimited, which is an American group committed to better trout and salmon fisheries.

Mr Dowling said the conference would be held at the Mansfield Performing Arts Centre on Saturday 21 November 2015, between 9.30am and 5pm, and that interested anglers should register online for free by visiting <a href="https://www.mansfieldmtbuller.com.au/twt">www.mansfieldmtbuller.com.au/twt</a>

"People unable to attend the conference will be able to watch presentations online a few weeks later on the Department of Economic Development's YouTube channel.

"For those anglers making a weekend of the conference and staying over the Saturday night, the Mansfield and District Fly Fishers Club has organised a Film Festival from 7.30pm featuring a series of short films about trout fishing. Admission is \$20 for adults and \$10 for children, and bookings can be made when registering online for the free conference."

#### FLY FISHING HACKS



Stripping guides on fly rods are often lined with a carbide ring to reduce friction on the fly line. When transporting a rigged rod, never hook a fly directly onto this ring, but instead secure it to the foot of the guide. A hook stored in the ring can chip the carbide, resulting in reduced performance and rapid wear on expensive fly line.

Increase your casting distance by stretching out your fly line before heading to the stream. Line stored in tight coils on a reel for extended periods will retain the 'memory' of that shape. Before fishing, spool line off the reel and stretch it out either between your hands or by passing it around a fixed object. Stretching the line will remove its memory and allow it to shoot farther with greater ease.





Fly-rod sections can get stuck together and become difficult to pull apart. If you have trouble breaking down a rod, first dry your hands and the rod shaft; often, the problem is an angler's inability to get an adequate grip on the rod, not a stuck ferrule (a connection joint). If that doesn't help, try to warm the stuck ferrule between your hands. If that too fails, place the rod behind your knees with the stuck ferrule centred, grasp the shaft on either side of the ferrule, and brace your wrists and forearms against your knees. Then push your knees outward, using your leg muscles to leverage the rod sections apart with steady pressure.

# Don't Be a Catch-and-Release Killer

Five tips you should always follow if you want to catch and release trout properly:

- **1)** Always wet your hands before handling trout, so you don't rub the protective slime off their bodies.
- 2) Keep the fish wet... you want to see the water dripping off the fish when you take the shot... a dry fish makes a bad photo.
- **3)** Keep the fish no more than two feet above the water... bend down for the shot, don't hold the fish at eye level.
- **4)** If a fish eats the fly deep, cut it off... performing surgery will kill the trout, and cutting off the fly gives them a chance.
- **5)** Hold your breath as you photograph a fish out of water... as you feel uncomfortable, odds are, the fish does also.

# FROM THE FLY TIERS DESK — ROYAL WULFF



1 Run the tying thread on at the eye, building a short section of close thread turns. Secure a bunch of white calf tail so that the tips project over the eye. Remove the waste ends, then divide the bunch with figure-of-eight thread wraps.



Wind the thread down the shank in touching turns, stopping at a point opposite the hook barb. Catch in a few fibers of brown bucktail as the tail allowing the waste ends to lie along the shank.



3 Secure the waste ends of the hair with open turns of thread. Then, at the base of the tail catch in two fibers of peacock herl. Wind them in close turns so that they cover one-third of the distance between the tail and the wing.



A Secure the loose ends of the peacock herl and remove them. At the base of the first body section, catch in 2 inches (5cm) of red floss and wind it along the hook to form a section slightly longer than the one of peacock herl.



5 Add a second section of peacock herl between the red floss and the wing. Select a brown cock hackle with fibers approximately twice as long as the hook gape. Catch it in by its base to the rear of the wing.



6 Gripping the hackle tip with pliers, wind on three or four full turns to create a dense collar. Make a further two hackle turns in front of the wing, securing the tip and removing the excess. Build a neat head and cast off the thread.
